About the project

The fundamental purpose of the RomaSam (We are Roma) initiative is to raise awareness and inform both professionals and the general public about the presence of Roma and Sinti in Slovenia, their culture, language, history, contribution to the community and their position.

At the same time, it offers innovative approaches to help inform and educate everyone about the Roma community. As part of RomaSam, an informative animated video is also being created, which shows Roma in various roles in Slovenian society. We address all current topics of the community, as well as those that are not (yet) talked about, such as LGBT activism within and for the community, the role of the elderly, the state of Roma education, etc.

Romasam.eu is a product of the Romobilization project, which came to life under the conceptual design of the Roma Academic Club and is financed by the Embassy of the United States of America in Ljubljana.

STATISTIKA

- približno 12.000 Romov v Sloveniji
- okoli 15 milijonov Romov v Evropi (vir: Svet Evrope)
- v Evropi okoli dva milijona Romov govori romski jezik
- v Prekmurju živi nekaj več kot 3200 Romov
- romski jezik (Romani čhib) je eden, samo v Evropi obstaja okoli tisoč narečij romščine
- v Sloveniji štiri večje skupine Romov: Romi v Prekmurju (migrirali iz Madžarske), Romi na Dolenjskem (migrirali iz Hrvaške), Balkanski Romi (živijo v urbanih mestih: Ljubljana, Maribor, Velenje) in Sinti (živijo na območju Gorenjske)

ZGODOVINSKI MEJNIKI

- Romi izvirajo iz Indije
- 2. avgust 1944: množični poboj Romov in Sintov v taborišči Auschwitz-Birkenau (vsako leto obeležujemo spomin na romske žrtve holokavsta)
- 8. april 1971: prvi svetovni romski kongres v Londonu, na katerem priznajo Rome kot narod, izberejo svojo zastavo in himno »Djelem, Djelem«
- 5. november 2007: prvi svetovni dan romskega jezika ob izidu hrvaško-romskega in romsko-hrvaškega slovarja

STATISTICS

- appx. 12.000 Roma in Slovenia
- around 15 million Roma in Europe (according to Council of Europe)
- there are only 2 million Roma in Europe that speak Romani language
- there is on Romani language (Romani čhib) and there are around thousand dialects of Romani language in Europe alone
- we find four larger Romani groups in Slovenia: Roma in Prekmurje (migrated from Hungary), Roma in Dolenjska (migrated from Croatia), the Balkan Roma (live mostly in Ljubljana, Maribor, Velenje) and Sinti (in the region of Gorenjska)

HISTORIC LANDMARKS

- Romani people originate from India
- 2. August 1944: thousands of Roma were killed in concentration camp Auschwitz-Birkenau (2. August is day of remembrance of all the Roma killed in the holocaust)
- 8. April 1971: first world Roma congress in London where they recognized the Roma as a nation, their flag and anthym »Djelem, Djelem«
- 5. November 2008: first world Romani language day

- Romani poetry, novels and short stories of the Roma
- dictionaries of Romani language and its dialects
- Romani music
- researching and preserving the Romani language
